Free NHS-funded **Online Mindfulness Course**

The Mindful Life Group is offering an online mindfulness course that is fully funded to support older adults (over 65) in Suffolk. The course is led by a clinical psychologist who is also a mindfulness teacher. The course is based on the mindfulness-based stress reduction course developed by John Kabat Zin but has been adapted for these populations.

We have had really good feedback from participants, and we have found that it improves peoples' attention and memory, as well as reducing loneliness, low mood, stress, anxiety and chronic pain. Many participants have found it simply helps them deal with dayto-day stresses.

We currently have one course running every Thursday from June 6th for six weeks between 1-3pm. Places are free but limited to around 15. More information can be found on our website: https://the-mindful-life.com/

Only 'material planning considerations' will be taken into account. e.g. local planning policy or loss of amenity (daylight, sunlight, privacy), potential highways issues, wildlife/ conservation, potential noise/smells etc.

D-DAY 80TH ANNIVERSARY



LIGHTING THE BEACON JUNE 6TH 9.15PM ON THE PLAYING FIELD

The 6th of June, 2024, marks the 80th anniversary of "D-Day" — Operation Neptune — the landing on the Normandy beaches, when Allied forces mounted the largest amphibious invasion the world has ever witnessed. In 1944 Operation Neptune saw over 5,000 ships and landing craft set down more than 130,000 troops on five Normandy beaches.

Gaining a foothold on the beaches allowed Operation Overlord to commence. 'Overlord' was the codename for the subsequent Battle of Normandy - an action that would begin the liberation of north-west Europe from Nazi occupation.

The bravery and sacrifice of those people in securing the peace and freedom we enjoy today will be observed by the lighting of beacons around the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories. In Mutford we are lighting our beacon at the prescribed time of 9.15pm on the playing field. This will be followed by free refreshments in the Village Hall where a short film on "D-Day" will be playing. All are welcome to attend this act of remembrance. Please note that the Village Hall will not be open until 9,00pm.

Advice to walkers and runners on country roads

On roads with no pavements pedestrians should keep to the right-hand side of the road so oncoming traffic can be seen. Keep close to the side of the road and be prepared to walk in single file if you are in a group. If you come across a sharp right-hand bend it may be safer to cross to the left-hand side of the road to gain visibility and cross back after the bend. Do not cross the road on a sharp bend.

Reporting Issues with Roads and Pavements

In **emergencies**, such as a missing manhole cover, if a road needs to be closed or where there is a potential danger to life call Suffolk Highways Customer Services immediately on 0345 606 6171. The line is available 24/7.

However if the emergency is on a trunk road in Suffolk. e.g. the A12, then please call the National Highways Information Line on 0300 123 5000.

Less urgent issues in Suffolk such as potholes, damaged pavements, road flooding etc. can be reported online where you will be asked to pinpoint the location of the issue on the map and describe the issue. This tool can be found at:

Please note potholes of 40mm depth or less are unlikely to be repaired but will still be recorded for future reference.

To report a power cut or to report damaged power cable / poles

Call 105 to report a power cut. This is a free-ofcharge call from any network. Do not call your electricity supplier. Electricity suppliers are not responsible for the power lines that connect to homes or businesses.
